
Where available, concession tickets are for: children 17 years and under, students, senior citizens over 65 years, unwaged people and people with disabilities or impairments.

## the body symphonic

'the body symphonic' (2024) is a solo performance-concert that observes the body as a site of resistance, an engaged body which journeys through rituals of excavation, revealing new and unbound mythologies and allowing for a limitless agency of self-representation and rootedness. Created in response to the multiple political and geopolitical crises in Lebanon — this work is a meditation on the body's place in the struggle against occupation, where looking back, looking in and forward become strategies of steadfastness and liberation.

## The Weight

'The Weight' is an immersive new dance work by Luca Truffarelli where ideas of freedom and subjection, the individualism of human beings and their basic human rights are reflected on. 'The Weight' evokes scenes from daily life, turned compelling through the gestural movements of a dance solo and the power of the orchestral score.

The production was born from Luca's desire to creatively conjure the places and people in society so often overlooked, challenging us all to take another hard look at each other.

Against a soaring orchestral backdrop specially composed by Greg Haines and recorded with the RTÉ Concert Orchestra, this new dance collaboration by Truffarelli, was originally conceived with Oona Doherty and developed with Swiss-based dancer Erin O'Reilly.

'MANY MEs' explores Rocío's experiences of transit, loss and rebirth. She delves into an unending quest for the completion of a rite of passage, where echoes of a sister's death, the lingering wounds of a violent love relationship, and the ache of a distant home intertwine.

Rocío immerses herself in the liminal space of mourning and uprooting, navigating a realm suspended in time. 'MANY MEs' is one of three productions in the series that the artist calls 'Steps Towards Myself', which includes works in different formats. In 'MANY MEs', Rocío collaborates with music composer Ingrid Bocek, and visual artist Ross Ryder, who conceived hologram effects within the piece.

## Bridging

#### Choreography by Amir Sabra

The name 'Bridging' is inspired by the place it was created for, the Living Bridge, located at the Irish World Academy in Limerick. In collaboration with the MA Contemporary Dance Performance students at the Academy, choreographer Amir Sabra with composer Rossa Ó Snodaigh and fellow members of the award-winning Irish band Kíla, invite the audience to experience an intercultural dialogue in a charged and contested movement space.

From the dancers' first step into the space, until their dramatic final movement on the ground, Amir's choreography inflects influences from his background in Dabke and Hip-Hop, supported by Irish traditional music with an Arabic music flavour.

'Bridging' was originally commissioned by Luail — Ireland's National Dance Company, to mark their foundational partnership with the Irish World Academy of Music at Dance at the University of Limerick in 2024. Luail is funded by the Arts Council / An Chomhairle Ealaíon.

## More coming up this spring

#### Associate Artist Alex Vostokova

OPEN STUDIO AFTERNOON | FRIDAY 21 FEBRUARY WORK IN PROGRESS SHARING | THURSDAY 06 MARCH

Compass Associate Artist for 2025, Alex Vostokova, will be in residence at Dance Limerick developing her solo piece 'Logic of Wrong and Rehearsed Carelessness', alongside Jason McNamara and Risteard Ó hAodha and featuring live cello accompaniment.

This work spills across themes of pressure, harmony, and the intensity of aliveness, inviting audiences into a world where the main character seeks to navigate these dynamics. During her time in Limerick, Alex will dedicate three days to researching with MA students at the Irish World Academy of Music and Dance. Through vigorous and improvisation-based practices, the group will be introduced to Alex's dynamic language that emphasises expression, character building and narrative exploration.

Vostokova's mentor Matt Szczerek will lead a krump-focused session, sharing tools that have informed this work in progress. Jason McNamara will also join with live music, creating a responsive environment encouraging students to access research and performance from a place of spontaneity and authenticity.

On Friday 21 February, Alex opens the studio to local practicing artists and enthusiasts for an OPEN STUDIO AFTERNOON. This session prioritizes discussion, sharing, and jamming, creating space for community interaction. On Thursday 6 March there will be a WORK IN PROGRESS SHARING, offering a glimpse into the evolving piece.

#### 'Begin Anywhere' by John Scott

SATURDAY 8 & SUNDAY 9 MARCH | 7.30 PM | DANCE LIMERICK

'Begin Anywhere', a John Cage quote, is a thrilling new work by Mel Mercier and John Scott, for five outstanding dancers from New York, France and Ireland and three musicians with backgrounds ranging from Sean Nós to electronic. 'Begin Anywhere' channels Cage and Cunningham's artistic universe and inspirations, from Marcel Duchamp to James Joyce. Commissioned by Irish Arts Center, New York, Both Cage and Cunningham have left huge influences on both Mercier and Scott. 'Begin Anywhere' is their response to their shared histories and influences, taking Cunningham and Cage's methodologies as a departure point.

This world premiere will be preceded by 'Four Solos' by Merce Cunningham, an arrangement of four solos choreographed by Merce Cunningham: 'Changeling' (1957), 'Solo' (1975), and excerpted solos from 'RainForest' (1968) and 'Travelogue' (1977). The solos will be presented in a continuous dance event with music by John King.






